#### 1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

Open Figure Skating Championships 2020 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2018, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2018, and the relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in the Open Figure Skating Championships 2020 is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 a) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 1420 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 1420 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate. Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must to be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

All competitors must be entered through their respective Member Federation.

Entries for young categories (Basic Novice and younger) may be done by clubs. These entry forms have to be sent and stamped by the national federation. Entries by parents or other private persons will not be accepted!

#### 3. ENTRIES

#### 3.1 Entries of Competitors

#### Citizen / Residency requirements and Clearance Procedure

In accordance with Rule 109 of ISU Regulations and ISU Communication 1420 or any recent update, all skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate upon registration.

The organizing club reserves the right to limit the number of competitors and judges, if need be, and to accept more competitors in every category.

Entries must be done with the attached Entry Forms for Teams and Judges! Along with the entry forms, the "Program Content Sheet" must be returned to the Organizing Committee with the deadline for entries. It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet is filled in precisely by each Skater in English using the terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

#### **World Standing Points**

n case the requirements as per ISU Communication 1629 are fulfilled, World Standing points will be awarded in the Senior Categories Men and Ladies.

#### 3.2 Entries of Judges

Each participating ISU Member may nominate one ISU or International Judge and one substitute Judge. The official entry form indicating the Judges must reach the Organizing Committee not later than April 21st, 2020.

For Basic Novice and Younger Categories, judges for National Championships will be accepted (ISU Comm. 1947).

In case of too many entries, the panels will be drawn immediately after the closing date of entries. The members concerned will then be notified of the result of the drawn panel(s).

Each panel of Judges will consist of 5 Judges, in categories Chicks, Cubs and Debs, Beginners panels of 3 judges may be used.

#### 4. ENTRY FEE

With the entry to the competition, the entry fee must be paid as follows:

#### 5. MEALS, LODGING and TRAVEL EXPENSES

The organizer will arrange full board accommodation for the Officials - Referees, Judges, TC, TS and D&R/O beginning with dinner May 7<sup>th</sup> until breakfast on May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020. The travel expenses will be covered only for Referees, TC, TS and D&R/O.

The organizer will not be able to cover any expenses for competitors, team leaders and coaches.

#### 6. MUSIC / PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

In accordance with Rule 343, paragraph 1, all discs must show the Competitor's name, the Nation and the exact running time of the music (not skating time) including any starting signal and must be submitted at the time of registration. Each program (short program, free skating, short dance, free dance) must be recorded on a separate disc. In addition, competitors/couples must provide a back-up drive for each program.

With the entry forms, the "Program Content Sheet" must return to the Organizing Committee in time. It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet must be filled in precisely by each Skater/team in English using the terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

Labeled CDs should be delivered to the organizer immediately after the arrival at the ice rink.

#### 7. OFFICIAL HOTEL

OC will only cover hotel only for ivited guests, officials - Referees, TC, TS and D&R/O

#### 8. SHUTTLE BUS SERVICE

OC will provide shuttle bus service only for ivited guests, officials – Referees, TC, TS and D&R/O

#### 9. RESULTS

The marking system (ISU Judging System) as described in ISU Technical Rule Single & Pair Skating 2018, Rule 352 and Rule 353 (Determination and publication of results) will be used.

#### 10. PRESENTATION

The three best placed Skaters/Couples in each event will be announced and honored. The national anthem of the winner will be played and the flags of the medal winners hoisted.

#### 11. INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole responsibility of each Member participating in Open Figure Skating Championships 2020, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means of the ill or injured person.

The Organizer assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred in connection incurred by Competitors and Officials. The medical emergency service will be present at the ice-rink during the Competition.

#### 13. VICTORY CEREMONY

The three best-placed skaters/couples in each event will be announced and honoured at the official Victory Ceremony.

Also the three best placed skaters/couples in each event as well as the invited guests, must participate in the Exhibition Gala at **on May 9**<sup>th</sup>, with an appropriate program.
