Economic Overview

a capitalist economy with a public sector accounting for about 40% of GDP and with per capita GDP about two thirds that of the leading euro-zone economies; tourism provides 18% of GDP; immigrants make up nearly one fifth of the work force; a major beneficiary of EU aid, equal to about 3.3% of annual GDP
