
It is my pleasure to welcome you to Kenyatta University for the 10th Edition of the Federation of Africa University Sports (FASU).



The Federation of Africa University Sports (FASU) awarded Kenyatta University through a competitive process the rights to host the 10th All Africa University games from 6th – 10th June 2022 at the University Main Campus. The FASU games will bring together over 2000 participants from various African Universities.

The All-Africa University Games (FASU Games) is organised once every two years as the flagship event with nine editions having been held (Ghana – 1974, Kenya – 1978, political instability across Africa affected the events until its revival in Nigeria – 2004, South Africa – 2006, Uganda – 2008, Namibia – 2012, Kenya-2014, South Africa 2016 and Ethiopia 2018).

The 10th Edition of the games will be officially opened by the First Lady of the Republic of Kenya Her Excellency Margaret Kenyatta.

Hosting of the 10th Federation of African Universities sports Championship is recognition of Kenya and is yet another opportunity to put Kenya on the international map. This is in line with the crucial role sports plays in overall national development. It is also a signifi-

cant milestone for Kenyatta University whose mandate is teaching, research and service to humanity. The opportunity resonates with the University's pursuit to nurture sports amongst the youth.

The University's past experience in hosting similar events as well as presence of requisite facilities and amenities, positioned Kenyatta University well to host the 2022 FASU games. The University has a wide range of sports facilities including fields, courts and synthetic track.

The games will be used to qualify Africa's representative teams to the FISU University World Cup Soccer 2023 for both men and women to be held in Jinjiang, China.

About the Host

Physical Education, Exercise and Sports Science

The Department dates back to the early 1970s when it started as the Department of Physical Education in the then Kenyatta University College, through 1985 when the institution gained full University status. It was the first such department to be established in the East and Central Africa region and is still the leader in preparing physical education teachers and tutors for secondary/high school and Teacher Training Colleges.

Subsequent to increased research and interest in the context worldwide, content in the academic discipline expanded, leading to new knowledge, concepts and theories related to human performance and sports. This has seen the establishment of related courses with distinct specialties such as Exercise and Sports Sciences.

The exercise science programmes in the department prepare experts in preventing and managing people with Hypokinetic and non-communicable conditions such as cardiac heart disease obesity, hypertension (high blood pressure), diabetes, arthritis, low back pain and several forms of cancer, which are becoming the leading health problems in the country and globally. The sports science programmes aim to prepare graduates with competencies to nurture and develop sports talent and improve performance.

In order to enhance the teaching of outdoor education and leadership, the department collaborates with the department of Recreation and Sports Management in the use of the campsite within the University.

On 6th February 2020, the Vice-Chancellor of Kenyatta University, Prof. Paul K. Wainaina officially launched the preparations for hosting the 10th All Africa University Games 2020 by commissioning the Local Organizing Committee (LOC), unveiling the Games logo and online registration portal. The Local Organizing Committee entrusted with the arrangements for the Games made all the necessary arrangements for the games with the approval of FASU. A number of teams worked tirelessly to ensure successful achievement of their specific mandates by simply utilizing consistent skill sets that elicit positive results. They believe in themselves and their ability to constantly improve. They set realistic goals, they surround themselves with the right people, and they stay the course through tough times.

To ensure adherence to the set guidelines during the preparations, Kenyatta University received a delegation from FASU on 14th and 15th March 2022. The aim of the visit was to assess the University's preparedness towards hosting the games. During the visit, the delegation conducted a physical tour of all the facilities and observed that the University had the capacity as well as the capability recommended for hosting the games.

Similarly, on 22nd April 2022, a Heads of Delegations Meeting was held virtually to check the levels of preparedness towards hosting the games. A virtual tour of the University's facilities was presented to the members who thereafter expressed satisfaction towards the determined efforts made.


The Cabinet Secretary was the Chief Guest at the ceremony. Upon her arrival, she was warmly welcomed by former Kenyan world athletes champions who were also invited to witness the event. In her keynote speech, Amb. Amina Mohamed expressed her wish that the University's Synthetic Track serve not only the University itself but also the community around it, especially the youth in sports. She added that she would like the University's athletes to make the entire fraternity of Kenyatta University extremely proud now that they have the much needed resources.

The event was graced to have globally reknowned champion athletes Tegla Loroupe, Douglas Wakiihuri, Catherine Ndereba and other famous Kenyan athletes. Tegla Loroupe was the first African woman to win a major marathon title. She uses sports to promote peace in the country. Douglas Wakiihuri is the personal trainer of the First Lady of Kenya, Mar-

garet Kenyatta and founding Director of Nairobi Sotokoto Safari Half Marathon Limited. He was the first athlete who put Kenya's name on the global athletics arena back in 1987. Catherine Ndereba has been nicknamed 'Catherine the Great' following her impeccable and top-level consistent performance in athletics.

A part from being used during the 10th All Africa University Games, Kenyatta University will also use the synthetic track for major sports events across other Universities, Secondary and Primary Schools as it is the first of its kind. The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Innovation and Outreach), Prof. Vincent Onywera, in an earlier similar event spoke on how this would be a boost to the local and upcoming athletes in aiding them to nurture their talent as well as prepare for international races.

The benefit shall also be extended to various Sports events that are expected to be held in the coming years. It is indeed a great facility that will promote sports development in the country. The KU athletes were excited to start practicing on the track. They even had a 100 meter race flagged off by the the Cabinet Secretary Sports, Culture and Heritage.

- 13. Sitting Volleyball court







Accommodation Services

The Nyayo Hostels within the University Main Campus will be the Games Village. This is a six-block facility which will provide adequate accommodation to the 2,000 sportsmen and sportswomen. The rooms are furnished with state-of-the-art fixtures and facilities with clean, quality, safe, comfortable, well-lit, ventilated and tiled walkways.

The facility is supplied with reliable fresh water by the Nairobi Water company and backed up by several boreholes and the various water towers. We have installed solar heating to provide warm water in all the shower cubicles. The facility has well-manicured lawns and meeting rooms for use by the sportsmen and sportswomen.

Additional 101 comfortable, spacious, self-contained and with a touch of African style accommodation will be provided at the Kenyatta University Conference Center (KUCC) located within the University. For guests requiring external accommodation, arrangements have been made in conjunction with hotels in Nairobi which include: SafariPark Hotel, Utalii Hotel and Maxland Hotel in Juja.



Games Village



A standard, well-equipped modern kitchen and cold rooms with adequate dining area and staff for provision of meals has already been put in place. It is located within the games village for ease of access by the athletes. Additional catering facilities for officials will be at the Kenyatta University Conference Center (KUCC) located within the University. The menus for the games have been selected. Good nutrition can enhance sporting performance.

Similarly, a well-planned, nutritious diet will meet most of an athlete's vitamin and mineral needs, and provide enough protein to promote muscle growth and repair; especially since they will still be practicing even as the competitions are on-going. Common foods rich in unrefined carbohydrates, like whole grain breads and cereals, should form the basis of the diet from various countries in Africa, with the consideration of the presence of diverse cultures.

At the most basic level, nutrition is important for athletes because it provides a source of energy required to perform the activity. The food we eat impacts on our strength, training, performance and recovery. Not only is the type of food important for sports nutrition but the times we eat throughout the day also has an impact on our performance levels and our bodies ability to recover after exercising. The catering team has understanding and expertise to incorporate all these in order to make the athletes feel comfort-

able and well taken care of.

Meals eaten before and after exercise are the most important in sports nutrition but you should really be careful with everything that you put into your body. As a general rule of thumb athletes should eat about two hours before exercising and this meal should be high in carbohydrates, low in fat and low to moderate in protein. Carbohydrates are the main source of energy that powers your exercise regime and protein is required to aid muscle growth and repair. After exercising they will need to replace the carbohydrates you have lost and you need to ensure proper muscle recovery by including protein in your post training meal.

There will be representation of different cultures via different cuisines. The catering department has a great task of incorporating nutrients and providing a well-rounded diet to the athletes. Imagine the tantalizing seasoning of food when you have sweet, sour, bitter, salty and spicy flavors. Most of the African cuisine luckily doesn't entail imported ingredients since they are mostly composed of locally available crops that can easily be sourced from the (Nairobi) city itself.

The athletes shall be in safe hands as the catering team is well experienced since they have been serving the institution for years.



Facilities

Medical and Anti-doping

Plans are in place to ensure availability of health services, suitable personnel and ambulance services. This will also be done in liaison with the County Medical Services and partner Hospitals as well as the Health Unit faculty available at the institution. There will also be fast responders who will attend to athletes who encounter an accident, so that they can be looked after to salvage their chance in the participation of the competitions.

The Games Village Medical Clinic consists of a waiting bay, consultation rooms, procedure room and pharmacy. The medical clinic shall take care of athletes in case of injuries or urgent medical attention. It is safe and has congenial staff who are always ready to provide the required services in the best manner possible.

The Anti-doping Control Centre consists of a waiting bay, sample collection lavatory, and doping control officer rooms. The center is responsible for managing the anti-doping program, including in-competition and out-of-competition testing, results management processes, drug reference resources, and athlete education for all the athletes. It also helps protect the wellbeing and the health of all persons taking part in the competitions as well as their rights.





Protocol, Hospitality and Ceremonies

KU has provided lounges for VIPs, delegates, athletes, team managers, sponsors and the FASU family. This will be done at the Business and Students' Services Center (BSSC). The opening and closing ceremonies will be held at the sports field arena while the Medal Awards Ceremony will be at the Business and Students' Services Center (BSSC). Necessary protocols in regards to the raising of national flags at the Games Village have been taken into consideration.

The institution has display signs distributed and put up all over campus to serve as a reminder to people and to caution them in case they slug. Additionally, there are enough sanitation points such as sanitizer dispenser points and water points with enough hand soap. The lavatories are up to standard as well.

Ushers shall be distributed evenly within the venue to provide guidance and offer help if need be. They shall welcome guests, participants and spectators to ensure a comfortable stay while at Kenyatta University. The institution has made sure to take the necessary steps to make the event successful and even mitigate unforeseen catastrophes.

Welfare and Entertainment

Wi-Fi is available in some proposed sections of the catering and accommodation areas of the Games Village and other designated areas.

Religious services are available through:

- a) Catholic Church
- b) Seventh Day Adventist Church
- c) Protestants Community
- d) Mosque for Muslims

Genres of Entertainment have been identified for all the days of the games and the process of Sourcing/Vetting for the internal and external providers is ongoing.

Daily Evening Entertainment will take place between 5th and 10th June 2022 at the Dome/Amphitheatre.

Possible excursion locations have been identified (Kenya Museums, Bomas of Kenya, Carnivore, and Nairobi National Park).

Psycho-Social Support will be provided in the Tents and Counselling rooms at Business Students Services Centre (BSSC).

Nyayo 1 Common Room/Dome/Amphitheatre will serve as the interaction/Leisure venues. Huduma Centre at BSSC 7 will serve as the venue for reporting lost and found items/valuables as well as the Call/Help Centre.

Security

The University has ensured availability of adequate security and safety for all the participants during the games.

To supplement the security services, the University works in liaison with the Kenya Police for provision of additional security personnel. The Games Village has a stand-alone police post for handling all security issues.

Transport

To provide suitable airport transfers and local transport services for teams and various officials, Kenyatta University vehicles will be used.
